Dear Knights,

I would like to extend a special thank-you to all of you and emphasize how very important the council's activities are, because you came to the aid of a fallen knight, I am his daughter, and you helped my family heal from our tremendous double loss. If any should ever question whether what you do makes a spiritual difference, I can whole heartedly state YES. Let this one example of outreach serve as motivation or encouragement to magnify participation in your council's activities. Your presence had a ripple effect and touched the lives that came to participate in prayer from South and North Carolina, Virginia, Illinois, and Ohio. They took your K of C message and, spreading out like the Apostles, conveyed to second, third and fourth generations about what they learned about the K of C.

My mom (Mary Anna) and I planned a gathering to coincide with the delivery of the monument and visit with the Honor Guard from the Mantua 3766 Council for dad (Lou Adams) in Ohio. Mom was going to be there, but she passed away the day before. That is the double loss I mentioned. Dad had the privilege of having the Honor Guard wear the traditional regalia. You can see dad's cape draped on the monument and the small framed photo is of mom and dad during the KofC Ball held Christmas 1959. (Preceding the feathered hats, they wore black top hats!) You can see the KofC emblem on the left corner of the monument.

During the tribute, we were moved by the description of knighthood, “upbringing of true Catholic manhood and good loyal citizenship...patriotism, loyalty to God and Country...fostered the practice of unity, the virtue of charity and brotherly love....” These words represented my father and all knights, something family knew, but hearing these words out loud made it so real to us and appreciative of the life my father lived as a knight and as an example of what we should strive for in our own lives.

When the knights drew their swords from their sheaths to salute dad that was a very moving moment. They also presented the family with a chalice and paten, engraved with dad's name. Both were used for mom's funeral two days later. Fr. Thomas Fanta from mom and dad's parish of the Church of St. Dominic in Shaker Heights, Ohio, will deliver the chalice and paten to sister parish Santo Domingo Church in Chiltupan, El Salvador; a poor parish, these items will be much appreciated. Continue your gift of spiritual love and support, provide the glimmer and spark of prayerful hope, be a man whom “exemplifies the sublime teachings of Holy Mother Church.” You helped heal us. You are a true example of Catholic faith, and families need to see you and feel your handshake or hug as these four Honor Guard knights did. Thank you.
